CCM Membership (and shows) Update – June 2010

Please join me in welcoming three new members to CCM this month. Coming to the club from Troy is Tom Sobanski and he brings a 2006 coupe. Along with Tom we welcome Bill Comisso of Detroit and his 2007 coupe. Returning to the club after an absence of several years is Glenn Grace of Northville and his 1986 coupe. Welcome all to the club! We hope to see you at many events and outings.

As I write this the 14th Annual Corvette Encounter is roughly ten days away. We are still in need of CCM member participation to make this a successful show. If you're not able to get an entry form in the mail in time for pre-registration, by all means come on out on the day of the show – June 5th. You can register on the day of the show. As previously mentioned this year's Encounter is two shows in one. We will have the judged competition, in which the highest scoring 75 Corvettes will be awarded trophies. In addition, we also have an NCCC sanctioned People's Choice show, in which the entrants and spectators will choose their favorite Corvette from the C1 through C6 generations. NCCC points will be awarded to those that are NCCC members.

By participating in this year's Encounter your Corvette could be eligible for recommendation to a new Corvette show that is being planned for September. Members from the Corvette Club of Michigan and members of several other Michigan clubs are working together to present *The Motor City Corvette Concours*. CCM along with Corvette Legends Club, Flint Corvette Club, The V-8 Estate Corvette Club, The GMC Corvette Set, Trend Settas Corvette Club and The Rainbow Corvette Club are working together along with show sponsor and presenter; Les Stanford Chevrolet Cadillac to bring the region the inaugural *Motor City Corvette Concours*. This show of shows will be held on Saturday, September 18, 2010 at the Les Stanford Chevrolet dealership in Dearborn. Actually the event will be three shows in one. First, is a NCCC sanctioned People's Choice show, in which NCCC points can be earned. Second, is a Judged Competition based on a drive and shine criteria. Third is a Concours level competition based on a show and shine criteria. The concours cars will be attending by invitation and will be competing for the Zora Arkus-Duntov trophy. These cars will be the best of the best. To qualify for a concours invitation the owners must compete in three other shows during the spring/summer season. Those cars will be recommended by the organizers of those shows. Recommendation must come from at least one of the three other shows in which you compete. The Arkus-Duntov trophy will be awarded to a single winner each year, a plaque will be attached recognizing that person and the trophy will be on display at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY. A smaller version of the trophy will be presented to the winner for his or her personal trophy case. All of the invited concours level owners will receive a special plaque acknowledging their attendance. Trophies will also be presented in the Judged Competition and the People's Choice shows.

So with all that being said, you, the members of the Corvette Club of Michigan, have all the more incentive to get out your favorite bottle of wax and bring your pride and joy out for all of the world to see. We acknowledged some pretty special Corvettes among our ranks a few months ago. We would be honored and would welcome those of you who are the owners of those special cars, if you are able to join us on that Saturday in September.

The committee is working to procure some other very special Corvettes and along with Corvette related artifacts to have on display to commemorate some of the milestone events in the history of "America's Sports Car". More details on what we hope to have available will come soon. A press release explain the entire show, judging criteria, class descriptions and entry forms are all available on the *motorcitycorvetteconcours.com* website. The organizers of this event all feel it is about time that we have a first class – high level Corvette show in the Motor City. After all, Michigan is the home of the Corvette and General Motors and if you read your most recent *Blue Bars* magazine you will know that CCM is the eleventh largest Corvette club in the country!!

Don't forget we have a few events coming up in soon; the June 20th autocross and our annual membership/ dinner cruise in lieu of our monthly June meeting.
